LHS Holiday Church Tour December 15

The society will help spread holiday cheer with *The Churches at Christmas*, a tour of Historic Churches in Lansdale this Saturday, December 15.

Visitors of all faiths are invited to participate in this first-of-its kind tour that begins at noon at the First Baptist Church and continues through the afternoon at the St. Mary Chapel, Lansdale United Methodist Church, Holy Trinity Episcopal Church, St. John's United Church of Christ and Trinity Evangelical Church.

The sanctuaries of the churches will be decorated for Advent and Christmas and tour guides will be on hand at each stop to provide information about the history of the buildings and the congregations that occupy them.

Proceeds from the sale of tickets will be divided among the churches.

Ticket sales will be limited, and we strongly encourage they be purchased in advance, at \$10 per person (ages 12 and under free), at any of the six churches on the tour or at the historical society research center.

Those participating in the tour must provide their own transportation from church to church. Guides and narrators will be on hand at the times listed below. The \$10 admission ticket admits participants to all six sites during the times listed below. Visit all or as many as you choose.

During 2018, we plowed ahead on a number of projects that will be ongoing for the foreseeable future. We have made steady progress in our efforts to convert our newspaper collection to a digital format. The same goes for our vast photographic archives which continue to grow. So too our efforts to copy and file obituaries from a number of local sources.

We participated in numerous outreach programs, among them a walking tour of the Lansdale Cemetery, a tribute to veterans at Memorial Park, our "High School Memories" open house, spring tea and the upcoming Holiday Church Tour. We supported events like Founders Day, the freight house restoration project and various Discover Lansdale undertakings.

As the headline states, the year ahead offers much progress but also considerable challenges. Among them:

- For the first time in the society's history we will be forced to rent off-site storage space at a climate-controlled facility. During the last 15 years since the research center opened, our rapidly expanding archives are spilling over into the aisles. It


is time to move lesser-used items off-site. This represents a new cost item for us.

- Our computer server, which has served faithfully for 15 years, is overdue for replacement. So is other computerrelated equipment that is outdated.
- The interior of the research center is in need of painting and a general reorganization to make better use of the space.
- Perhaps more than anything else we need additional volunteers who can devote a half day or two each week to help

us with a variety of projects. We especially need younger volunteers who can lend a hand physically when we need it.

Fortunately, our overall membership totals are healthy, but don't forget we depend on you for the financial support that allows us to continue our efforts to preserve the past for future generations. We hope we can count on you again (See story on next page).

More than 40 volunteers spent December 5 sorting the banners on a series of tables that filled the hall's lobby. According to our treasurer, Anne Scheuring, who led the banners campaign in Lansdale and other nearby communities, the banners have about a three-year lifespan when exposed to the weather. A waiting list for a new three-year banner campaign is now being assembled.
